

Luke 12:13-15, 22-24, 29-31

¹³Someone in the crowd said to Him, "Teacher, tell my brother to divide the family inheritance with me." ¹⁴But He said to him, "Man, who appointed Me a judge or arbitrator over you?" ¹⁵Then He said to them, "Beware, and be on your guard against every form of greed; for not even when one has an abundance does his life consist of his possessions."

²²And He said to His disciples, "For this reason I say to you, do not worry about your life, as to what you will eat; nor for your body, as to what you will put on. ²³For life is more than food, and the body more than clothing. ²⁴Consider the ravens, for they neither sow nor reap; they have no storeroom nor barn, and yet God feeds them; how much more valuable you are than the birds!

²⁹And do not seek what you will eat and what you will drink, and do not keep worrying. ³⁰For all these things the nations of the world eagerly seek; but your Father knows that you need these things. ³¹But seek His kingdom, and these things will be added to you.

Pleonexia – *polus* = much
pleion (comparative)
echo = to have
- Worry
merimnao – to be pulled apart

WEAPONS

- Consider - *kata* = down
noeo = to think

God's great global generosity

- Seek
- "Do not keep worrying" (v. 29)
meteorizomai = "to be lifted up"
